1	<b>Start your adventure strong with a picture at the iconic Navy Yard entrance gate!</b> Throw your arms wide, or strike a power pose—you're officially one of the over 130,000 guests that visit the Navy Yard every year!	
2	There are anchors scattered all around the Navy Yard, a nod to its rich maritime history. <b>See how many you can spot and capture a photo with your favorite one.</b>	
3	From the Navy Yard, you can see Philadelphia's iconic stadium complex, home to the Eagles, Phillies, Flyers, and Sixers. <b>Find a spot where you can see the stadiums and give us a glimpse of these sports landmarks, as seen from the Yard!</b>	
4	Students from Mural Arts Philadelphia's free after-school program came together to paint a vibrant shipping container mural at the Navy Yard. <b>Find the mural and take a moment to appreciate the artwork and document your favorite detail.</b>	
5	Central Green is an award-winning, five-acre park known for its unique circular design that's perfect for exploring. <b>Find one of the signature circles in the park and strike a pose inside or outside it.</b>	
6	Did you know the Navy Yard is a Level One Arboretum with over 2,000 trees rooted in its history? <b>Find a tree that speaks to you—tall, twisty, leafy, or lovely—and snap a photo beneath its branches.</b>	
7	Designed by world-renowned architect Bjarke Ingels, 1200 Intrepid is hard to miss with its eye-catching curved facade inspired by the nearby circular park, Central Green. <b>Find this futuristic building and take a photo that highlights its bold curves and creative angles.</b>	
8	Capture the spirit of the Four Chaplains! <b>Snap a powerful photo of the Chapel that symbolizes the mission of the Four Chaplains Memorial Foundation—faith, courage, and cooperation.</b>	
9	<b>Say hello to Alpha Sacred Beings (The Origin of Creation)—a life-sized Parasaurolophus dinosaur skeleton that's been calling the Navy Yard home since 2022!</b> Created by artist Marianela Fuentes, this stunning sculpture symbolizes a bridge between two Indigenous Nations.	
10	A red and white sign bearing the word "Mirage" is the only remaining remnant of the Navy Yard's temporary public art installation, Greetings From The Mirage, a larger-than-life desert dreamscape that invited visitors to explore an immersive world in 2023. <b>Track down the sign and snap a shot that pays tribute to the public art pop-up.</b>	
11	With over 6 miles of scenic shoreline, the Navy Yard's waterfront is perfect for peaceful strolls, breezy views, and waterfront wandering. <b>Find your favorite riverside spot and strike a pose with the water in view.</b>	
12	The Navy Yard is always growing, with new buildings, businesses, and green spaces. <b>Find an active construction zone and give us your best "hard hat" pose, from a safe distance, of course!</b>	
13	The <b>Lunch Truck Lineup</b> runs seasonally from April to October, bringing Philly's favorite food trucks to the Navy Yard several times a week! <b>Grab a snack from one of the trucks and grab a picture of your snack in all its yummy goodness.</b>

14	As Philly's public-private economic development corporation and the Navy Yard's lead developer, PIDC has a full-time crew hard at work in Building 101. <b>Snap a pic outside the office and give a little wave to the team leading the Navy Yard's transformation.</b>	
15	The Navy Yard continues to produce major commercial ships and ship components for the U.S. Navy, while honoring its history with vintage ships that can be seen throughout the Navy Yard. <b>Find the largest ship in the Yard and take a picture below its mighty bow!</b>	
16	From 1861 to 1903, Admiral George W. Melville led groundbreaking advancements in naval engineering. <b>Hunt down his statue in the Navy Yard and capture a photo honoring the legacy of this maritime innovator.</b>	
17	Weekdays at the Navy Yard come with a sweet perk— <b>bright and cheerful buses</b> that zip to and from Center City and NRG Station! <b>Grab a picture of one cruising through the Yard, and give the driver a friendly wave.</b>	
18	There's nothing like cruising through the Navy Yard on two wheels—and thanks to Indego, it's a breeze! With three bike share stations across campus, adventure is always a ride away. <b>Find an Indego bike and show off your ride-ready look.</b>	
19	URBN, with its portfolio of brands like Urban Outfitters, Anthropologie, Free People, Terrain, and more, was one of the first major companies to call the Navy Yard home, moving its HQ here back in 2004. <b>Swing by URBN's expansive campus and snap a stylish shot.</b>	
20	Stop by Dry Dock Park, a peaceful corner of the Navy Yard nestled beside a decommissioned dry dock that once hosted towering naval ships for repair. <b>Find the edge of the dock and capture a photo of history on display.</b>	
21	The 26th Street Lift Bridge is a towering piece of naval infrastructure that once helped reduce wartime traffic congestion at the Navy Yard. Now an important connector between the Yard and the rest of South Philadelphia, it's a true landmark. <b>Snap a photo of the bridge from the safety of the sidewalk!</b>	
22	Did you know the Navy Yard is also home of one of Philadelphia's rich snack food, Tastykake. Sometimes you can even taste the sweetness in the air. <b>Snap a quick pic of their iconic sugar towers.</b>	
23	Did you know M.Night Shyamalan filmed scenes from The Last Airbender at the Navy Yard? Building 120 doubled as a soundstage for the movie. <b>Can you track down this piece of Hollywood history and grab a shot from outside?</b>	
24	With nine miles of streets and sidewalks, the Navy Yard is a perfect spot for dogs and their humans to stretch their legs. <b>Snap a cheerful photo of a pup enjoying the Yard - with their owners permission, of course! (Not pictured on the map)</b>	
25	From fitness pop-ups to beehive tours to family-friendly festivals, the Navy yards hosts over 100 public events annually. <b>Browse the Yard's event calendar, head to an event that catches your eye, and capture a moment from the fun. (Not pictured on the map)</b>
